SEA CHANGE

Twelve months ago, we asked you to put your trust in us to make our Worthing the greenest, fairest Coastal Town in the UK. In the 2022 elections, you did just that, electing a further 10 Labour Councillors bringing our total to 23 and giving Worthing a Labour Council for the first time ever.

It has been a year of hard work, at times exhilarating and often exhausting! The Cost of Living Crisis has affected us all. Rents, mortgages, energy bills, food bills – everything has become more expensive.

Far too many people have had to rely on local food banks in spite of working long hours and many being key workers we clapped for during the pandemic.

Much of our time and resources as a Council this year has therefore been to ensure that our housing services and our amazing community run food banks and other key organisations have had the resources and support they need to help people to stay in their homes, keep

them warm and to feed their families.

We have also focused on changing the conversation between the Council and the Communities we serve. Through our Big Listen and continuing local ward work, we have continued to build those essential bridges to make sure that all our Council work is done in partnership with local residents.

This updated manifesto gives a summary of some of the key achievements from the past year and how we plan to build on these achievements going forward.

Greening our town, making it a safe and welcoming place for all and providing decent, sustainable housing for all our residents stay at the top of our agenda – they are your priorities and that makes them the priorities of the Council.

We look forward to listening to you, working with you and for you in the coming year.

A COUNCIL FOR THE COMMUNITY

We are a listening, community-first council.

We have:

- Undertaken our first "Big Listen" out and about with our red deckchairs listening to you, our Communities, about what matters most
- Declared a Cost of Living Emergency and put together an action plan with our key partners across the town to provide support to our most vulnerable residents
- Held Council Meetings in the Community as a first step to make Council decision making more accessible to you
- Worked with our local bus company to offer a free Christmas bus service into the Town Centre

- Open up our Community Fund (the Community Infrastructure Levy – CIL) to make it accessible to as wide a variety of local groups and projects as possible
- Prioritise our work with young people this year, making sure that their needs are highlighted and addressed in our work
- Continue to work on reducing inequalities in our town through our Cost of Living plan, alongside our Community wellbeing and mental health work



TURN OUR SEASIDE TOWN GREEN

Our response to the Climate Emergency is immediate, decisive and runs through everything we do. We want Worthing to be a green coastal town and we are putting in the hard work needed to achieve this. Our Environment team is ensuring that we are doing all we can with our approach to waste collection, keeping our streets clean, and providing and protecting great public amenities and green spaces.

OUR CLIMATE & ECOLOGICAL EMERGENCY

We have:

- Put in place "Trees for Streets," an easy to use crowdfunding scheme that will provide much needed urban tree planting for our town
- Stopped using harmful pesticides in parks and open spaces
- Worked with our Environmental partners to ensure the success of Sussex Bay Marine Reserve the marine wildlife coming back to our shores is incredible!
- Allocated wildlife verges and park space. Places where vegetation can grow that will support biodiversity



- Reach our net carbon zero target by 2030 for council operations and by 2050 for all of Worthing
- Improve energy efficiency in Council owned buildings and seek funding to insulate our emergency and temporary accommodation
- Undertake a Big Green Clean Up where all residents have the opportunity to help our town to be clean and green!
- Plant wildflower and ecological corridors in key areas of the town
- Maintain and enhance seafront and foreshore planting
- Bring together Climate Emergency and Public Health work, tackling air pollution and mental wellbeing through urban greening and sustainable transport networks

TURN OUR SEASIDE TOWN GREEN

WASTE

We have:

- Introduced kerbside recycling of electronic waste currently collecting 1 tonne per week!
- Undertaken Poo Patrols!
 Councillors, officers and community members have been clearing up huge amounts of dog poo in our parks and open spaces. Please do pick up after your dog!

- Continue to work to exceed national recycling targets, including increasing the number of public recycling bins
- Introduce food waste collection and more community composting
- Work with local schools and communities to identify and work with recycling champions









A TOWN TO BE PROUD OF

Regenerating Worthing continues with us reaffirming that we care about the town. We are focusing on improving our seafront, parks and open spaces. Major sites, including Teville Gate, Union Place and Montague Square are being developed to reflect the creativity and heritage of Worthing, as well as providing the housing and amenities that our town requires. We are creating the 'Greenest town on the South Coast' by combining regeneration, with climate action.

Our plans don't just focus on the town centre, but also on our out-of-town neighbourhoods, so that everyone across the town will see improvements. A focus on community wellbeing and safety are making Worthing a seaside town to start well, live well, and age well in.

We have:

- Worked with key community stakeholders to put together a green, community focused design for Montague Place, which will breathe life back into the heart of our town
- Held two "Big Clean Up" events, with Councillors, Officers and Community Members cleaning up the Town Centre and Beach House Gardens
- Worked with local Community groups to provide better accessibility for wheelchair users onto the beach

- Publish the green, Community focused design for Montague Place and look to allocate funding and to build it out by the end of 2024
- Focus on improving edge of town areas, with a first focus on Montague Street West, Brighton Road and Chapel Road
- Work to improve out of town areas, starting with Ham Road and Tarring Road
- Resubmit our Bathing Water status application for East Beach and submit an additional application for Goring Gap



We have:

- Put new playgrounds into Palatine and Brooklands Parks that are accessible and inclusive for all.
- Undertaken a public toilet review and with funds available, commissioned a new Changing Places facility to be built this Summer
- Worked with the Community Safety Partnership to reduce crime and disorder through a public health approach to reducing offending

- Work hard to get spades in the ground at Teville Gate and Union Place asap! Negotiating with developers for the fairest, greenest deal possible for our town
- Continue to work with West Sussex County Council towards a car-free town centre and seafront, with comprehensive bus, pedestrian and cycle networks across our Borough
- Fund a design plan for the George V to Sea Lane Cycle path and look to allocate funding for the build as soon as possible












HELP WHEN YOU NEED IT







REVENUES & BENEFITS We have:


- Adopted an Ethical Debt Policy
- Scrapped the £5 minimum Council Tax charge for working age residents
- Launched a No Interest Loans Scheme (NILS) with our Credit Union partner, Boom
- Started the work to link UC payments to local authority support, to trigger adjustments that get people support ASAP

- Digitise the Revenues & Benefits system and make the benefits awards process more open
- Update our website to improve user experience

- Making sure free public space community broadband is available across the town
- Improving IT access in our libraries, council offices, community and children's centres
